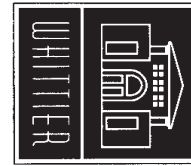

Whittier Law School is a national school committed to excellence in legal education and responsibility in community service. To this end, the Law School established the Center for Children's Rights (CCR) for training superb advocates to serve the needs of unrepresented children. The Center annually accepts up to twenty students as Fellows who complete a specialized multi-disciplinary curriculum which provides students with opportunities to develop legal, social, psychological and medical insights into issues that affect children. CCR students have the nation's largest juvenile population and court system as a live classroom for exploring children's legal issues. On campus, they have the opportunity to work on actual cases affecting children in Whittier's Children's Rights Clinic. Through coursework, clinical experience and monthly colloquia, they gain a solid foundation for serving as children's advocates in the future.

The Center also serves as a resource for practitioners and scholars. The Center sponsors Symposia and publishes the *Whittier Journal of Child and Family Advocacy*, one of the few scholarly publications focusing on legal issues related to children and families.

The Academy of California Adoption Lawyers and the Academy of California Family Formation Lawyers are invitational societies of family formation law attorneys whose membership is limited to those licensed California attorneys with extensive adoption and assisted reproduction expertise whose practices are of the highest standards of ethics and professional competence.
